Message from Father Steve,

"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

Here is a great love story. *"A man once observed a young boy out in a field flying a kite. He noticed something odd about the way the boy was standing and holding on to the string. He walked up to the boy and then learned that the boy was blind. He said, "Do you like flying kites?" The boy said, "I sure do." This piqued the man's curiosity, and he asked, "How is that when you cannot see it?" The boy answered, "I may not be able to see it, but I can feel it tugging!"* We may not always be able to identify the love of God in this world. Like the little boy, we may not be able to see love, but it has a tug that lets us know it is there."

God's love is revealed to us in many ways, many times, and when we least expect it. It comes in the form of a smile, a hug, a compliment, a simple action of friendship. Autumn is a great time to see God's love in full color as the seasons change. All summer, we drove by that big oak tree, not giving a second glance. Overnight the plain green leaves become brilliant in a color that nearly stops us in our tracks. Expressing love is not about doves, hearts, and puppy eyes, but more about our actions and how we perceive and treat each other. It is about how we accept difficulty in our lives. Loving each other unconditionally requires a deep dedication and commitment that unifies us into one body. That force is the power of the Holy Spirit that works inside us. *"There is a story about a man who had a huge boulder in his front yard. He grew weary of this big, unattractive stone in the center of his lawn, so he decided to take advantage of it and turn it into an object of art. He went to work on it with hammer and chisel and chipped away at the huge boulder until it became a beautiful stone elephant. When he finished, it was gorgeous, breath-taking. A neighbor asked, "How did you ever carve such a marvelous likeness of an elephant?" The man answered, "I just chipped away everything that didn't look like an elephant!"*

Respect Life Corner- "You know what sort of people we were among you for your sake." In the Seconding Reading of 1 Thessalonians, we learn how Paul was able to lead many people to Christ as they were inspired not only by his teaching, but by the way he lived his life when he was among them. They saw how the Gospel truly shaped his life and his view of how others should be treated. Paul could live with such suffering and immense joy at the same time! His prior conversion from Saul, helped the Thessalonians turn away from false gods as well. Changed hearts led for a wider spread of understanding of the Gospel, so much so, that Paul wrote, "we have no need to say anything." **Learn, Act, Connect and Pray-** Have you ever had a role model in your life to help you chart your path with God at the helm? Even Saul, turned Paul could go on to become one of the greatest role models in our faith; giving real advice on how to handle the tough situations we often find ourselves in. Maybe you are the role model someone is waiting for. If Saul can become Paul, who can you become?



Love God, Neighbor, Self. There are 613 Old Testament laws guiding faithful behavior. The Exodus writer tells us some: do not molest or oppress aliens, do not wrong widows and orphans, do not extort money from the poor, do not, do not, do not. Jesus gives us a summary in two laws (rooted in Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18): (1) Love God with everything you have and are and (2) Love the neighbor as your very self.

- What will I do to love a foreigner, an alien, someone not like me?
- What will I do for someone who is poor, hungry, out of work?
- What will I do?

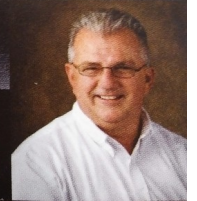

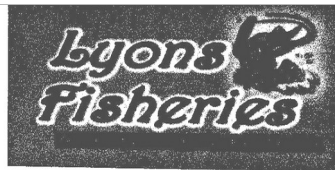
