Respect Life Corner- “The Spirit drove Jesus out of the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan.” In Mark’s Gospel, 1:12-15, Each year, the First Sunday of Lent we are immediately taken to the scene of Jesus’s temptation in the desert by Satan. The forty-day time period signifies a time of preparation and orientation that allows Jesus (and us) to see the world in a new way. Like Noah’s forty days on the boat in in the First Reading from Genesis, it is a rebuilding of our commitment to God and allowing His vision for our lives. After the temptation, Jesus emerges with full authority, stronger, as He proclaims that “the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.” **Learn, Act, Connect and Pray-**We too are tempted, yet we too have worth and purpose. We are called by Our Father to a vocation that He has in mind for us. Whether it being praying for the unborn, helping a mother in need, or welcoming an immigrant to our community, these small acts make a big difference in building up the Kingdom of God. During these 40 days of Lent, may we pray for God’s grace to move in our lives as He shows us new opportunities to grow in faith as we firmly say “yes” to all God has in store for us. Lent has just begun. Let’s work to emerge stronger than ever in our faith pray “Lord, help us follow you into new life this Lent.”



Message from Father Steve,

I can describe my vacation in one word, “awesome.” As most of you know, I took a few days off last week and went to a much warmer place than Southern Illinois! It was a system shock, on my return, when the plane landed at Lambert, and the Pilot, in his monotone way, said, “welcome to St. Louis, the temperature is 7 degrees!” Blessed is how I feel getting the opportunity to spend some time just doing nothing. As most of you know by my smile (under the mask), I am happy serving God’s people in Sandoval and Centralia. Coming home is a blessing, too, even the frigid north.

My frig was empty, so I made a trip to pick up a few things. As I strolled through the local store, there is already an abundance of bunnies, baskets, and Cadbury chocolate eggs for sale. Unlike its Christmas counterpart, Easter is mostly uncommercialized, which is pretty remarkable: the day that we celebrate the glory of Christ’s resurrection remains untainted by retailers. Easter is perhaps the most crucial holiday on the Christian calendar—even the word crucial has its roots in Christianity, stemming from the term for crucify.

“And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts, and the angels waited on him. Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the Good News of God, and saying, “The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the Good News.”— Mark 1:12-15

The season we call Lent, the forty days before Easter, represents the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, continually tempted by Satan. When He emerged from the wilderness, He knew it was time for the prophecy of His death and resurrection to be fulfilled. As believers, we remember this. We look to this time of Lent as a way to go into our own ‘wilderness’; we pray; we fast, we meditate, we worship, we focus on God. We ready ourselves for the grief of Christ’s death, and we take joy in the gospel of His rising again. We are granted eternal life through Christ, the Messiah.

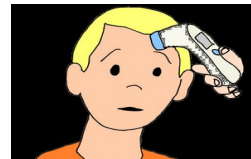
That brings us to the question, what are you giving up for Lent? This is a particular time of reflection and faith, practiced in prayer and by the act of giving up something. That “something” depends on the person observing Lent, with the main guidelines being that it has to be something that’s challenging to give up during this period. (In other words, giving up chores wouldn’t fit the bill.) In all, the act of giving up something for Lent is to practice self-discipline and remember the sacrifices Jesus made. Enter the desert, and prepare for Jesus’ passion and death.



It’s Okay to Be Tempted. True. But it is not okay to give in. Just as Jesus spent his forty days in the desert protected by the Spirit, let us have the same trust that God guides us on this Lenten retreat to right Kingdom thinking, speaking, and behaving. Let us sing with the Psalmist that God’s ways are love and truth, guiding the humble to justice.

- Since the Kingdom of God is at hand, how will I repent?
- What must I stop saying and doing to embrace more fully this Kingdom?
- How can I work for justice?

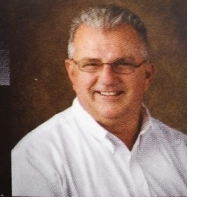

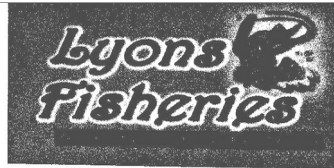
